MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER & FLAG SALUTE: The meeting was called to order by Chairman, M. Carreira, at 6:00 p.m.

FIRE: The January report was reviewed by Fire Chief Ryan Davis and Deputy Chief Craig Russell.


POLICE: The January report was included in Selectmen material for review. Deputy Birch was able to attend the meeting.

FW BUSINESS: 6 Month Budget review - The Selectmen reviewed the treasurer's expense report. The budget appears to be on track with no anticipated shortfalls. No action needed, for review only. A printout of any revenues received will be provided before the next meeting as requested.

Sprinkler System Ordinance Discussion - Deputy Chief Russell and Chief Davis led the discussion, explaining their reasons for supporting this idea. They suggested that this could be applied to multi-unit dwellings and commercial buildings of a particular size, although some towns require this system to apply to all dwellings. After some back-and-forth discussion, board member D. McCluskey suggested they look at the idea again in the fall, so they can see if there is any effect on building by developers in Holden, where a similar ordinance was recently passed.
