**CALL TO ORDER:** Meeting called to order at 6:31 p.m. by J. Brooks



**ROLL CALL:** Selectmen present were: J. Brooks, D. Goodwin and C. Baker  
C. Grover and B. Glass had excused absences.



**NEW BUSINESS:** Holden School Property – Transfer

Ralph Russell had attended the school board meeting and he feels that the board should take a look at what the property transfer includes. He said excess property also means the memorial park, front gazebo, playground and ball fields. Ralph questioned why this should be considered excess property when the district is still using it. He pointed out that the town of Holden could potentially suggest a lease, in case of the schools need to use such property in the future. Ralph Russell asked the board to keep an eye on the situation and don't just give up the property. In an RSU, the property would revert back to the town, if the school was no longer a school. He suggested a letter be drafted by selectmen, in support of S.A.D. 63 keeping the land.

A motion was made, seconded and passed to draft a letter in support of keeping control of the land with S.A.D. 63


